DIARY OF A VICAR'S DAUGHTER AGED 11½

Some of you may have read in *The Link* parish magazine that the curators at Shandy Hall recently discovered a diary from 1911 by 11½-year-old Ruth, the daughter of Coxwold's then vicar, Rev Ernest Hedger. The diary has some charming illustrations and observations by Ruth of her early life at the vicarage in Coxwold. The curators' hunch that a certain Miss Ruth Hedger mentioned in a newsletter article about Hushwaite Church in the 1950s, '60s and early '70s does indeed refer to the same young diarist! They would love to find out more of what became of the older Ruth, and would be glad to hear from anyone who knows anything about her.
