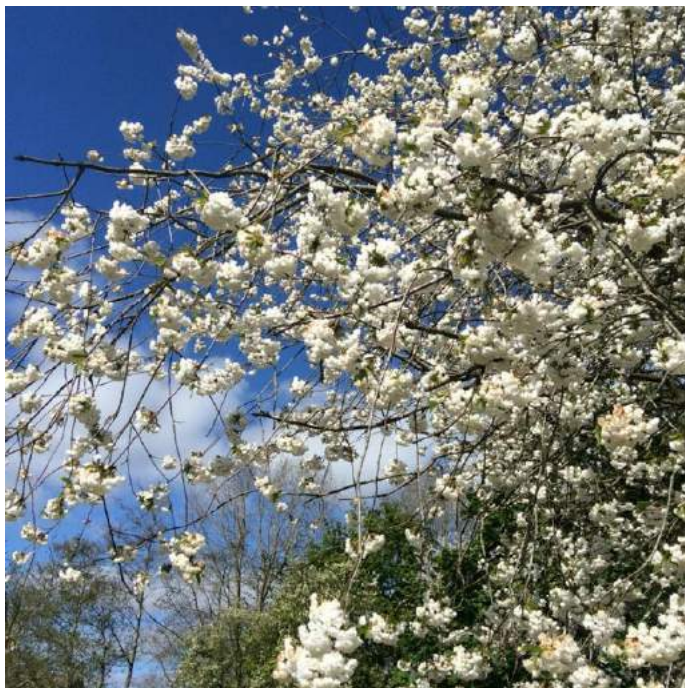

**Coxwold Institute** was built in 1926 on land leased from Newburgh Priory. A large extension was added in 1988 when the building was renamed Coxwold Village Hall. The property and land are managed by Coxwold Playing Field Association, a registered charity. Income to cover insurance, utility bills and maintenance comes from bookings and fundraising. A substantial sum of money has also come from lottery and other grant funding for acoustic and heating improvements, as well as our wonderful recent kitchen refurbishment. We also receive money from the National Parks for the public toilets outside. Of these, only the accessible toilet is open at present.

## ST MICHAEL'S CHURCH
