This is a cause for concern with the planned closure of Sutton Bank from 5/09/16 The arrows on the bollards in the Newburgh Road are the wrong way round and will need to be corrected Speed gun:- data collection about halfway through and 2,173 vehicles have been monitored. A help sheet has been prepared to deal with enquiries from the public and ensure a consistent approach among the volunteers. The police have also conducted radar checks in the village.
