Numbered bays had been put in place which appeared to have eased the immediate problems.</p> <p>The Car Park users group representatives expressed concern that in spite of a number of initiatives being discussed the residents hadn't been updated in respect of what was going on.</p> <p>Following discussion the Parish Council agreed to replace the signage as this had not been completed. A draft sign, to be erected facing the road, will be sent for approval to the users group.
